Family Engagement Goals/Outcomes

DPfC will provide support based on our 6 components of Family Engagement:

ADVOCACY AND DECISION-MAKING: Parents/guardians are full partners in decisions that affect children. They have something critical to share at each developmental stage and are included as participants in decision-making in: curriculum, school decisions, governance, and advocacy through parent organizations.

COMMUNICATION: Communicate with families about school programs and student progress through effective school-to-home and home-to-school communications.

COMMUNITY COLLABORATION: Coordinate resources/services for students, families, and the school with businesses, agencies, and other groups, and to provide services to the community.

PARENTING/TRAINING: Assist families with parenting and child-rearing skills, understanding child and adolescent development, and setting home conditions that support children as students.

STUDENT LEARNING: Involve families with their children in learning activities at home, including homework and other curriculum-related activities and decisions.

VOLUNTEERING: Schedule to involve families as volunteers and audiences at school to support students and school programs. Families are invited to share cultural traditions/customs, provide support and their strengths.

2. Click <u>here</u> to download *MyTeachingStrategies*[™] Family Portal- an observation-based assessment system designed to engage and include families in meaningful ways, including family communication tools to help share information about children's learning and development between school and home. Available for Apple and Android devices.

3. Register for <u>Ready4K</u> by texting DPFC to 70138- free text message curriculum for parents and caregivers of children age birth to eight that gives them the information they need to help build their children's language and literacy skills by the time they start kindergarten. The Partnership believes Ready4K is a tool that compliments all the work we do here in Durham County.





What to expect from DPfC?

Our objective is for families, children, and early childhood professionals to feel more connected through the collaborative process of family engagement by building positive relationships that honor family culture and foster child success. We will accomplish this in many ways:

Parent/Guardian Surveys

 Parents/guardians may rate their overall experience during the placement process and provide suggestions on how the experience can be improved. We will also evaluate the six components of family engagement from the parent's/guardian's perspective.
 Families are able to provide feedback regarding support and services received. Your participation helps us advocate for resources!

Photographic & Video Release Form

Opens the lines of communication early and strengthens the relationship with the teacher! (may be virtual to ensure your safety due to COVID-19.)

Remote Moments

Blocks of live, direct, remote instruction delivered daily by lead teachers or teacher assistants



Family/Child Check-ins

Formal parent/guardian-teacher conferences

To (1) share academic progress, (2) to be better informed about students' strengths, needs, behaviors, and learning styles, (3) discuss enrichment/intervention strategies, and (4) discuss issues that may be interfering with students' learning and growth

Opportunities for the teacher and a child/family to connect live through two-way communication every week while the child/family is participating in remote learning
